## OHIO 4-H CODE OF CONDUCT

4-H members, parents, and other adults participating in 4-H activities will:

- 1. Adhere to program rules, curfews, dress codes, policies, and rules of the facility being used.
- 2. Conduct themselves in a courteous, respectful manner, use appropriate language, exhibit good sportsmanship, and provide positive role models.
- 3. Abstain from illegal behaviors, use of alcohol, illegal or illicit drugs, tobacco in any form, and/or any vaping products during 4-H events and activities.
- 4. Fully participate in scheduled activities.
- 5. Respect other's property and privacy rights.
- 6. Abstain from child abuse (physical and/or verbal) and harassment.
- 7. Accept personal responsibility for behavior including any financial damage.
- 8. Be responsible for any financial damage caused by inappropriate behavior.
- 9. Adhere to rules of safety.
- 10. I will uphold and support the responsible and lawful use of social media. In so doing, I will not create or post social media content that is abusive, threatening, defamatory, obscene, harassing, or creates a hostile environment.

As a program participant in OSU Extension, 4-H participants must not engage in discriminatory behavior, which includes harassment, discrimination, sexual misconduct, and retaliation. This means you should not exclude anyone from participating in any program or activity or discriminate against them because of their identity. Identity includes: age, ancestry, color, disability, ethnicity, gender, gender identity or expression, genetic information, HIV/AIDS status, military status, national origin, pregnancy, race, religion, sex, sexual orientation, or protected veteran status. #### **Expectations of Trumbull County 4-H Parent & Guardians**

The following is an agreement accepted by parents and guardians involved in the Trumbull 4-H program. These expectations shall guide the adults' behavior during their involvement in 4-H, Extension programs and the Trumbull County Jr. Fair. The primary purpose of these expectations is to ensure the safety and well being of all Extension program participants (i.e., members, parents and families, volunteers, and professionals). Parents and members are expected to function within the guidelines of Ohio State University Extension and the 4-H program.

# 4-H Parents will behave in a manner which promotes good character:

- \* I will be supportive of the county program, help my child with project selection, and assist my child with project completion without doing the work for my child or another member.
- I will conduct myself in a courteous and respectful manner, exhibit good sportsmanship, and be a positive role model for all youth and adult volunteers. This includes all 4-H related events and any social media platform related posts. (including but not limited to Facebook, Instagram, Twitter).
- I will respect, adhere to, and enforce the rules, policies, and guidelines established by Trumbull County 4-H, its 4-H Club, Ohio State University Extension and Jr. Fair Species' Rules.
- # I will uphold an individual's right to dignity, self-development, and self-direction.
- \* I will handle animals and operate machinery, vehicles, and other equipment in a responsible and respectful manner. I understand and will adhere to proper ethical treatment of animals.
- \* I will see that my child attends all scheduled 4-H club activities and notify the club advisor if my child is unable to attend.
- \* I will help with club and county 4-H activities such as fundraising, refreshments, and other club and county needs. I understand I am responsible for turning in complete funds for any fundraiser my child participates in on behalf of the club or program. Failure to do so may affect 4-H eligibility for my child/children.

## As a 4-H parent/guardian, I WILL NOT:

- We use or possess drugs, alcohol, and/or related paraphernalia during a 4-H related activity. If I use tobacco products, I will do so in designated areas so I do not jeopardize an individual's or animal's health and safety.
- **W** Use foul, vulgar, inappropriate language or gestures in person or on social media platforms.
- Steal or be in possession of stolen property.
- Physically, verbally, or sexually harass, threaten or behave in such a way that could cause mental distress or physical injury to any person.
- **%** Possess, handle, transmit, or conceal any object that can be construed as a dangerous weapon or instrument.
- Engage in abusive behaviors that physically or verbally threaten or harm any Extension program participant, including youth.
- **Commit a felonious act.**

Failure to adhere to these expectations may result in removal from the Ohio State University Extension Program. By signing these expectations, I/we understand that my/our behavior could affect my/our child/children's 4-H eligibility.
