Checklist for General/Still Projects:

- Enroll in 4-H by Monday, April 1, 2024 (online enrollment for existing families [www.4honline.com], paper enrollment for new families). This also includes parent/guardian expectations form. **Make sure the proper projects are enrolled for the new year.
 - Select a project book that fits your interests (fill out cover) *This is required. Must complete
 book and have it ready to be viewed at General Project Judging:
 - Various Areas of Project Work
 - Communication (ex. Public Speaking)
 - Creative and Leisure Arts (ex. Photography/Arts)
 - Healthy Living (ex. Keeping Fit/First Aid/Mental Health)
 - Home Living (Makeover my Space/The Laundry Project)
 - Leadership & Citizenship (One on One/My Hands to Larger Service)
 - Money Management (Becoming Money Wise/Financial Success)
 - Natural Resources (Gardening/Exploring the Outdoors)
 - Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) [Robotics/Woodworking]
 - Self-Determined: Find Idea Starters at https://ohio4h.org/books-and-resources/self-determined-projects-and-idea-starters.
 - Workforce Preparation
- Read over and understand club rules.
- Attend General Project Judging on Thursday, June 20, 2024 from 6:00-8:00 pm at Champion Christian Church.
 - Bring completed project book.
 - Bring poster or display as listed in Trumbull County Project Completion Requirements (found at: https://trumbull.osu.edu/program-areas/4-h-youth-development/4-h-project-information).
