CLUB INSURANCE REMINDER

The Sr. Fair Board is requiring that ALL 4-H Clubs obtain accident insurance through American Income Life Insurance. Rates are \$1.00 per member/advisor or \$2.00 for horse members/advisors. A copy of your receipt is required to be turned in to the Sr. Fair Board Office ASAP. You will not receive your club's ticket packet until this is received. Please also give a copy to the OSUE Office.

2021 TRUMBULL COUNTY 4-H STEM DAYS

We will be doing two STEM Days again this year located at the OSUE Office for youth in grades K-5. The first session will be held Wednesday, August 11th from 9:00 AM-1:00 PM. The second session will be Friday, August 13th from 9:00 AM. to 1:00 PM. Light refreshments will be provided. Youth will get to do hands-on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) activities throughout their time with us.

4-H CLUB MINI GRANTS

The 4-H Advisory Committee provides opportunities for financial assistance in regards to club educational activities, community service projects and other educational endeavors. Mini grants are offered quarterly (April 1, July 1, September 1 and January 1). In order to receive a mini grant, clubs must fill out an application and detailed budget. The mini grant maximum per quarter is \$500.00.

4-H News for Advisors and Members

4-H MEMBERSHIP-AFTER APRIL 1ST

After the April 1st enrollment deadline, members are locked into the club(s) and projects they have enrolled in for the year. Please contact the office if deletions need to be made. It is normal for members to drop projects and it is appreciated when information is communicated with the OSUE Office.

Membership can still be granted after the April 1st deadline by way of “associate membership”. This means that the 4-H member can join the 4-H club and attend meetings, club activities and complete project judging but they are not permitted to exhibit their project at the Trumbull County Fair or Ohio State Fair for competition. If you have questions, please do not hesitate to ask.

ADVISORS' GRADE SHEETS

4-H members who are enrolled in a general/still project who are not able to attend General Project Judging on June 24, 2021 must schedule a makeup date with their advisor or species' chair. Advisors may obtain grade sheets from the OSU Extension Office. Advisors should turn in project grade sheets to the OSUE Office no later than **July 1, 2021**. You may use the A, B, C system (blue, red and white ribbons). Members should receive a grade ribbon for each project in which they have enrolled in and completed. ***This option does not apply for animal projects who will be exhibited at the fair***

IMPORTANT: All 4-H members must complete project judging in order to receive a fair pass and receive project completion credit for the year. In the order of fairness, general and clothing project members must attend their assigned date in order to be eligible for state fair competition.

Please register your club's booth with the Jr. Fair Board Office so that it may be judged and accounted for properly. They will have a slip to fill out. Judging will occur on Tuesday, July 13th at 10:00 am. Judging will be completed no later than 1:00 pm.

FACE MASK UPDATE

Effective immediately, June 1, 2021: Face masks are not required to be worn inside or outside at 4-H camp (day or overnight) for ALL employees AND clientele. Face masks are not required to be worn inside or outside at any OSU Extension (including 4-H non-camp) programs and activities for ALL employees AND clientele.

All other health and safety guidance is still in effect, such as physical distancing and sanitizing.

Local guidance (i.e., local health department, local landlord or building requirements, etc.) prevails, if there are more stringent requirements.

Individuals and/or family members may not attend if they or anyone living their household is experiencing any of the following symptoms: fever, cough, shortness of breath, loss of sense of taste or smell, or as been directly exposed (confirmed or suspected) to COVID-19 if they are not fully vaccinated.

These guidelines may be modified at any time if conditions change, and/or if the guidance is not followed, and/or if a local health department issues more stringent requirements.

YOUTH CONDUCT DURING THE FAIR

Youth are held to the Ohio 4-H Code of Conduct throughout the 4-H year. This includes but is not limited to the Trumbull County Fair. Misconduct that results in harm to a person, animal or property will be investigated by the Trumbull County Sheriff Dept. and prosecuted to the full extent of the law. Please be mindful of your behavior. You are representing our county 4-H program.

4-H MEMBER & ADVISOR

FAIR PASS INFORMATION

Packets of Fair Passes for 4-H members and advisors will be ready for pick up at the Sr. Fairboard Office starting July 1. Club rosters are not sent to the fair office for packets to be put together until the club's activity fees are paid (June 1) and project judging is completed. A club advisor must pick up and sign for the packet. Advisors are responsible for fair passes. Please make sure you distribute them to your members before fair begins. Members in more than one club will be given their fair passes through their PRIMARY CLUB. Thank you!

ALL unused advisor and member tickets should be returned to Jan Solomon at the Sr. Fair Board Office. This provides the fair board with an accurate count of what was used. If you have youth who signed up for your club but did NOT fully participate in club activities, you have the option to withhold their fair pass. If a youth did not attend project judging in some capacity, they should not be given a fair pass. Fair passes are a privilege and gift from the Sr. Fair Board.



WEIGH-IN SCHEDULE

Animals will be weighed in on Tuesday, July 13th and will be taken in the following order (approximate time):



Hog- 8:00-10:00 AM
Sheep & Goat- 4:00 PM
Dairy Feeders- 4:15 PM
Beef- 4:30 PM
Poultry- 5:00 PM



DRUG USE NOTIFICATION FORMS FOR MARKET LIVESTOCK ANIMALS

Every Market Livestock Animal must have a DUNF Form on file with the Fair Board on the DAY OF ARRIVAL AT FAIR. Absolutely no exceptions! It is the 4-H member's responsibility to complete forms for each animal they bring and present it to the designated advisor upon completion of the animal's healthcheck and/or weigh-in. Do not leave your animal on Tuesday until you have turned in your completed Drug Use Notification Forms. Failure to turn in these forms on the first day of Fair may result in you being asked to remove the animal OR you being unable to show the animal for competition. Even if cattle do not milk in the parlor, but they milk on the premises (same for goats), they still need a DUNF form! Forms will be distributed to all club Head Advisors. Head Advisors will need to distribute the forms to members, collect completed forms, and then turn them back in to the designated Jr. Fair Livestock Sale Committee or Sr. Fairboard member.

HEALTH CHECKS

All animals will be health checked when you check in at the Fair. Animals presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease. If there are questions regarding the health of your animal, you may be asked to produce proof that your animal is in good health or may even be asked to remove your animal from the Fairgrounds. This is done, not only for the safety of your animal, but other animals and people who come in contact with the animals as well. ***Rabies** vaccines are required for dogs, cats and ferrets (pg 23). Do you have further questions regarding health requirements to exhibit at the fair? Reference page 51 in the fair book to read over health rules.

ANIMAL GROOMING & CARE

A friendly reminder to advisors, family members and 4-H members that 4-H projects are the responsibility of the 4-H member. This includes feeding, watering, washing, cleaning pen or area, grooming, etc. A parent can be present to assist when needed but the majority of the work should be done by the youth. Thank you for your cooperation.

Registration/Ownership Papers

Please be sure to have registration/ownership papers available if this is required in your species area. You may be asked to leave if you do not have these papers readily available.

Are you interested in exhibiting in open class? Open entries are due **Saturday, June 26th by 4:00 pm.** to the Sr. Fair Board Office. FAIR CLEANUP

The designated "Jr. Fair Clean-Up" date is Saturday, June 26th. Please help us make the fairgrounds and barns look their best! The fairgrounds will be open from 9:00 AM- 4:00 pm.

SPRAY DATE- July 7th. All barns must be cleaned by the spray date. Fairgrounds will be closed on the spray date – no one is permitted in the barn areas.

Junior Fair Livestock Sale

The 2021 Junior Fair Livestock Sale will be held on Saturday, July 17th beginning at 10:30 am. in the Sale Building. Please encourage family, friends and business associates to support our county's youth by participating in the sale and bidding process. Questions regarding buyer's passes can be directed to Mike McCaslin at 330-889-9050.

The sale order is as follows:

Sale Fees: A small fee will be associated per animal/lot and will be deducted from Junior Fair checks to cover promotional and advertising expenses for the Junior Fair Livestock Sale. All check will be held until drug tests are confirmed.

Pull Fee Procedures: All animals weighed and then pulled must pay a \$10.00 pull fee to the Livestock Sale Committee. A pull sheet form will be available from your advisor or a director from the Livestock Sale Committee. Forms must be turned into advisors within 1 hour after the completion of the species' show. Forms are forwarded to the Treasurer of the Livestock Sale Committee.

A 4-H member may only send a **max of four animals** through the sale. If you entered more than four market animals, you will have to declare which ones will be sold.

All Champions of hogs, lambs, and beef must be sold and slaughtered; all champion hogs, lambs and beef will be hauled directly to the harvesting facility on the last day of fair. All other animals, per species rules.

ENTRY/EXIT FROM FAIRGROUNDS

Gate C will be open until 10:00 AM throughout fair for bringing in supplies and going to campers. As always, cars and trucks may not be parked against or in barns. All vehicles are prohibited in barn areas between 10:00 AM and 11:00 PM. Violators will be towed.

BED PASSES/CURFEW

Jr. Fair exhibitors staying on the fairgrounds overnight who are not in a camper **MUST** get a bed pass from the Jr. Fair Office. The bed pass must be filled out correctly with appropriate signatures and returned to the Jr. Fair Office prior to office closing. A triplicate form provides a copy for the family, Jr. Fair Board Office and the sheriff on duty. Curfew remains at 12:00 AM.
