TRUMBULL JUNIOR FAIR ANIMAL POSTER CONTEST RULES

1. Each poster must be made by a 4-H member enrolled in an animal project. Registrations forms must be returned to the Extension Office no later than July 1st in order to participate in this event.
2. Members taking more than one animal species may enter more than one poster. However, if display space is limited, members may be asked to choose one poster to enter/display at the fair.
3. Posters must be turned in to Poster Contest Chairperson (any 4-H Silver Claws Club Advisor) any time between 10am and 4pm on Tuesday of Fair Week. Silver Claws Advisors can be located in the Small Animal Barn. Advisors are: Barb Ames, Melody Lynn, Marie Moore.
4. Posters must be made on 22"x28" poster board, displayed horizontally. Posters should not be mounted on any type of stiff backing.
5. It is recommended that all posters be covered tightly with a thin, plastic covering or laminated in order to protect it during fair week.
6. No 3-D posters will be accepted.
7. Each poster must be clearly labeled in the lower, right hand corner, in a space on larger than 3"x5" with member name, age as of January 1st, small animal species, and club.
8. Posters should reflect an educational / informational aspect of the animal specie.
9. Posters will be judged on neatness/appearance, educational/informational content, and originality/creativity.
10. 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Place Ribbons will be awarded for each species.
11. Age divisions:
 - Junior (ages 8-11)
 - Intermediate (ages 12-14)
 - Senior (ages 15-18)
 - *4-H Age (as of Jan 1)
