By reviewing and completing the activities and records in the Ohio 4-H resource handbooks and project books for food-producing animals, 4-H members will better understand and implement the Good Production Practices in addition to other aspects of Quality Assurance (ethics, animal welfare/well-being, food safety, and government regulations).
